Indiana Campus Compact 2019 Brian Douglas Hiltunen Faculty Award for the Outstanding Contribution to the Scholarship of Engagement

The Brian Douglas Hiltunen Award is presented annually to recognize faculty at Indiana Campus Compact partner campuses who are exemplars of the scholarship of engagement.

In his essay, *Creating the New American College*, the late Ernest Boyer challenged higher education to recommit to service. He expressed concern about a “growing feeling in this country that higher education is a private benefit, not a public good.” To address this concern, Indiana Campus Compact developed the Faculty Fellows and the Scholarship of Engagement programs to support faculty in their endeavors to recommit to service and thereby become connected to the community. Brian Douglas Hiltunen served Indiana Campus Compact for four years as a project director and helped to design these programs, prior to his death in 1999. The Hiltunen Award was established in 2000 to honor Brian’s legacy and his work with faculty who are practicing the scholarship of engagement.

This award has been endowed in perpetuity through the generosity of the Hancock Hiltunen Caito Family.

CONDITIONS

- **Applications and supporting material are due October 25, 2018.**
- **Award winners will be announced** and finalists will be recognized at the Indiana Campus Compact Annual Awards Gala on Monday, February 25, 2019 at the Indianapolis Marriott North. **You must attend the Awards Gala to receive your award.**
- All applicants must register for the Gala by January 26, 2019. **Registration is free for each award applicant and one guest.** Instructions for registration will be sent to all award applicants in December.

The winner will receive a cash gift of \$500.00* and we encourage donating a portion to an Indiana-based community partner in order to further its service to the community.

*Payment will be processed after a signed w-9 is returned to Indiana Campus Compact. Please allow up to 12 weeks for processing.

Your application will be reviewed based on your ability to meet the following criteria:

- Demonstrate a clear picture of how you **incorporate** service-learning, community-based research and/or other community engaged pedagogies into your teaching
- Include a thoughtful **reflection** on the impact of the practice of the scholarship of engagement as a teacher and a scholar
- Provide high quality **quantitative AND qualitative examples** of innovative programming for students and the community and is able to describe the **outcomes**
- Provide high quality examples of your community engaged teaching and scholarship through **publications (traditional and non-traditional) and presentations** and the impact of such published work
- Provided high quality examples of your **commitment to professional service** in addressing community issues and long-term solutions.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Full-time faculty members on Indiana Campus Compact campuses are eligible to apply for this award by submitting the following:

- Application Cover Sheet, with **completed** background information
- **Abstract** in the form a short, powerful statement that addresses **why you are applying for the award**
- Essay (**no longer 1,000 words**) which addresses the guidelines outlined on the application cover sheet. This is your chance to **tell your story**
- At least one letter of support from an administrator, faculty member, student, or staff member from your institution
- One letter of support from a community partner
- Curriculum vitae (**no longer than five pages**)
- Video introducing yourself and **repeating your abstract** (short powerful statement that addresses **why you are applying for the award**). **The video should be no longer than 3 minutes** in an .mp4 format. This video is not required, but it can be a powerful supplement to your application. **The technical attributes of the video will not be considered during review, however it will be played at the Awards Gala on February 25, 2019**

- 300 dpi print quality photo for publicity.

In **no more than 1,000 words**, please address the following:

- How are service-learning, community-based research and/or other community engaged pedagogies incorporated into your teaching?
- What is the impact of the practice of the scholarship of engagement for you as a teacher, a colleague, and a scholar?
- Describe any innovative programming that you have created and/or implemented which has greatly affected the campus and the community and discuss the outcomes - **include qualitative information such as quotes and stories along with quantitative information. How does this relate to the public good?**
- Discuss how you document your community engaged teaching and scholarship through

publications (traditional and non-traditional) and presentations, proving yourself as a scholar and advocate for the field.

- Evidence of your commitment to professional service in addressing community issues and **long-term solutions**; and
- Highlight most relevant published work related to the scholarship of engagement and the impact of such published work.
