Expanding Campus-Wide Community Engagement Grant

- Supports institutions to shift the culture while deepening a campus-wide ethos for community engagement. This work is done through either 1.) completing Indiana Campus Compact's community engagement strategic planning and self-assessment process; or 2.) implementing an intentional combination of professional development workshops and learning communities designed to better prepare faculty and staff to implement high-quality community engagement practices.

- A re-design of our current recognition opportunity, the Emerging Leaders in Community Engagement recognition will allow for recognition of staff and practitioners who embed community engagement into their work.

Developing Publicly Engaged Scholars Series

- A re-design of the previous Colloquium of High-Impact Community Engagement Practices, this new series will consist of three once a year programs:
 - Service-Learning Institute
 - Focuses on the basics of curricular course design, as well as introduces participants to the concept of high-impact community-engaged practices as conceptualized by Hoy and Johnson (2013) as participants examine their learning objectives and end with focusing on how to work with community partners to co-create high-impact experiences for their students.
 - Facilitators of Authentic Community-Campus Engagement (FAC2E)
 - Addresses the lack of professional development opportunities available to novice community engagement professionals (CEPs) in relation to their movement from mid-level to high-level community engagement officers. Participants will conclude the program with the development of personal professional development plans for each participant and the identification of and connection to a mentor.
 - Colloquium on Authentic Community Engagement
 - Focusing on the intersection between community engagement, high-impact practices, and critical theory and practice, the Colloquium encourages those who implement both curricular and co-curricular community engagement teaching and learning practices to further develop these experiences by applying a critical lens to their partnerships.

Access to collaborative Professional Development through new partnerships across the U.S.

- A partnership among 11 other state community engagement organizations across the U.S. that supports our partners' campus-community engagement and service-learning activities, research, and overall mission.
