<p><b>Faculty Fellows.</b> A year-long learning community experience designed to support the development of en-gaged faculty scholars. Each year, the cadre of selected scholars will work collaboratively on a scholarly project that will seek to advance the understanding and practice of the field of community engagement through the collaborative engagement research paradigm, while individually incorporating community engagement into the three components of faculty work: teaching; research; and service.</p> <p>Funding up to \$3,800 with a minimum cash match of \$1,520.</p>	<p>Faculty</p>	<p>Letter of Intent: March 22, 2019</p> <p>Proposal: May 13, 2019</p>
<p><b>High-Impact Community Engagement Practices.</b> A six-twelve month grant to support development &amp; implementation of a high-impact community engagement learning practice for both curricular &amp; co-curricular experiences which incorporate an intentional emphasis on community-engagement practices—e.g., place, humility, intagration, depth, development, reflection, teams, capacity building, impact orientation, evidence, learning, mentors, and sequence. Funded projects will support strong, reciprocal community-campus partnerships that strengthen student learning, and further support a culture of community engagement within the institution.</p> <p>Funding up to \$2,500 with a minimum cash match of \$750.</p>	<p>Faculty Professional Staff Graduate Student</p>	<p>Proposal due the second Monday each quarter: February May August November</p>
<p><b>Strengthening Communities.</b> A two-nine month grant to support community-campus engagement projects, including episodic place-based, short-term ongoing co-curricular community engagement activities, and training and advocacy initiatives addressing systemic community issues. Projects should seek to further the development of high-quality community-campus partnerships where all partners are able to transcend self-interest as a means of seeking mutual benefit.</p> <p>Funding up to \$1,200 with a minimum cash match of \$360.</p>	<p>Faculty Professional Staff Graduate Student Undergraduate Student</p>	<p>Proposal due the second Monday each quarter: February May August November</p>
<p><b>Institutional Research and Student Success Learning Communities.</b> A one-year funding opportunity to support research projects that either A) ask questions regarding community engagement initiatives, pedagogies, or programs and their relationship(s) to student success during or after college (e.g., students' persistence, DFW rates, GPA, graduation rates, alumni outcomes, alumni engagement, etc.) or B) seek to understand and analyze complex data sources in order to generate compelling information that decision makers can use to inform community engagement efforts at your campus (i.e., conduct institutional research projects).</p> <p>Funding up to \$3,800 with a minimum cash match of \$1,140</p>	<p>Faculty Professional Faculty</p>	<p>Letter of Intent: March 18, 2019</p> <p>Proposal: May 13, 2019</p>
